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Meaningful observations: Examples of documented observations situations, we adjust and refine our behaviour accordingly. Example (when): Observing the ability of teachers to re-engage students after coming back from an emergency such as a minor earthquake. Observing the ability of journalists to quote their sources in tweeting or posting on social media sites while listening

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to their sources talk.

### 5+ Ways of Writing an Observation Report Examples

- Important items or observations relating to an event/ experience/development, such as "Johnny can now write his own name on his work" Possible Topics to Document
- Individual child growth and development, such as language development progression
- Expected behaviors (at group time, in using a certain toy, while eating together)
